### Computer Games

They isolate children socially and distract them from learning, right? Think again. Researchers have found that kids who <u>clock up</u> regular console time can improve their hand-eye coordination, their grip on science, even their IQ.

A 2002 study of 700 children found that stimulation and adventure games such as Sim City and RollerCoaster Tycoon developed children's strategic thinking and planning skills. A research by Peter Excell, head of computing and communications technology at Glyndwr University in Wales, suggests computer games are a great way to explain the basics of physics. (A weapon thrown in a game, for example, has to follow a certain trajectory, illustrating the laws of gravity.)

Bishop John Robinson Primary School in Thamesmead, London, actually started a pilot project in September last year using 16 Nintendo DS consoles running the *Maths Training Game* with a Year Five class – who were so engaged that other classes are now sharing the consoles and some students have asked their parents to buy the games to use at home.

### Passage 2

For any business, the cost of transportation is normally the largest single item in the overall cost of physical distribution. It doesn't necessarily follow, though, that a manufacturer should simply pick the cheapest available form of transportation. Many companies today use the total physical distribution concept, an approach that involves maximizing the efficiency of physical distribution activities while minimizing their cost. Often, this means that the company will make cost tradeoffs between the various physical distribution activities. For instance, air freight may be much more expensive than rail transport, but a national manufacturer might use air freight to ship everything 10 from a single warehouse and thus avoid the greater expense of maintaining several warehouses.

When firm chooses a type of transportation, it has to bear in mind its other marketing concerns-storage, financing, sales, inventory size, and the like. Transportation, in fact, can be an especially important sales tool. If the firm can 15 supply its customers' needs more quickly and reliably than its competitors do, it will have a vital advantage: so it may be more profitable in the long run to pay higher transportation costs, rather than risk the loss of future sales. In addition, speedy delivery is crucial in some industries. A mail-order distributor sending fruit from Oregon to Pennsylvania needs the promptness of air freight. On the 20 other hand, a manufacturer shipping lingerie from New York to Massachusetts may be perfectly satisfied with slower (and cheaper) truck or rail transport.

### WORKPLACE ETIQUETTE

WANT TO MAKE A MEMORABLE impact in your first job? Keep in mind it's not only your work performance that employers notice - it's also your work etiquette.

Patrick Sullivan, who runs the Canadian job-search website Workopolis, offers three tips for teens as they pursue holiday or part-time jobs.

**Dress for success**: From the start, dress appropriately - not like you're meeting school pals. It shows you're serious and mindful of the environment. "When applying for a job, dress like you're already an employee there. And once you get a job, ask how to dress. Don't look at it casually because it's short-term."

Give co - workers their due respect:

"Not just because they're older or have been there longer, but because you'll learn from them. Ask questions about the job, how people operate, and what's appropriate in the workplace. It will put you in good stead."

Remember the basics: "Smile, look people in the eye, and shake hands firmly. You've been hired for a reason. Present yourself confidently, and you'll be treated with confidence."

Common courtesies can pay off in great references from your employers. "That first job is your foundation," says Sullivan, "and you need to leave a positive impression."
